

## JUDICIAL & PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MINUTES

January 4, 2019

Public Safety Room – Courthouse/Law Enforcement Center - Montello, Wisconsin  
Chairperson Ken Borzick called the Public Safety Committee meeting to order at 10:06 a.m.

Members present: Ken Borzick, Alan Gibeaut, Bob Miller, Jon Sheller and Mary Walters. Supervisor Judi Nigbor was also present.

Moved by Alan Gibeaut and seconded by Bob Miller to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Moved by Mary Walters and seconded by Alan Gibeaut to approve the minutes of the December 4, 2018 meeting. Motion carried.

Citizen concerns: none.

Moved by Bob Miller and seconded by Jon Sheller to approve the vouchers from the departments/offices. Motion carried.

Reports were received from departments with no business items. Coroner Tom Wastart (cases up), Emergency Management Aaron Williams (Spring flooding concerns), D.A. Chad Hendee and Clerk of Circuit Court Shari Rudolph both present.

Chief Deputy Joe Konrath was present for several agenda items. Joe updated the committee on the status of the NextGen 911 – cutover scheduled for January 30<sup>th</sup>, training modules in progress, planning for Columbia County reciprocity MOU.

There was discussion regarding a contract with the City of Montello for police services involving two Patrol Deputies with wages and benefits to fully reimbursed to Marquette County. Mayor Doudna and members of the City Council were present.

Moved by Mary Walters and seconded by Bob Miller to approve the concept of a contract for police services to the City of Montello and forward the matter to the Executive & Finance Committee. Motion carried.

Joe reported Scott Johnston will be the new Chief Deputy Sheriff opening a vacancy for a Detective Sergeant and an internal posting has taken place for that position. There is an eligibility list in effect for Patrol Deputy vacancies. A new eligibility list will be needed for Corrections/Dispatch positions.

EMS Director Jarrad Jungenberg reported on the one-year contract for 2019 ambulance service to the Town of Jackson.

Moved by Mary Walters and seconded by Alan Gibeaut to authorize signing of the one-year contract with the Town of Jackson based on per capital costs of 2018. Motion carried.

Work will commence on a long-term contract with the Town of Jackson.

Jarrad reported the LOSA payouts have been completed for EMS personnel qualified to receive same. Jarrad reported the Federal Correctional Institution is currently being served by Lifestar. Jarrad reported ambulance unit 88 will be taken to Alabama next week for the scheduled re-chassis work.

Clinic health service options were discussed, and upcoming meetings noted.

Upon completion of the agenda Chairperson Borzick declared the meeting adjourned at 10:37 a.m.
